2019-2020 Transportation

Please feel free to contact the Transportation Office with any questions or concerns. We are here to help and open from 7:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. Emergency calls can be made any time during these hours. Due to call volume, we recommend making routine phone calls between 9:30 a.m. and 2 p.m.

Transportation is provided as follows:

Policy

- Students in grades Pre-K through 5 who attend school more than 1 mile from their home
- Students in grades 6-12 who attend school more than 1.5 from their home
- Pre-K students must be four years of age or older before December 1 in order to be eligible for transportation
- Disabled or special needs children in accordance with recommendations of the Committee on Special Education

Measuring Distances

The district measures the distance between the student's legal residence and the school. Distances are measured along public roads used by cars and similar vehicles. The distance measured is between the driveway of the student's legal residence and the main entrance to the school grounds used by the bus.

If you move, please notify your school immediately. Transportation will be set up after your school notifies the Transportation Office.

Each student is assigned to a bus Stops bus stop in the neighborhood of the student's legal residence. The student will only be transported to and from the bus stop to which the student is assigned. Changes in transportation cannot be communicated by children.

Buses travel main roads. Routes are designed with central pickup points.

You will receive a card from the Transportation Office letting you know where your child's bus stop is and estimated pick-up time. *Times are subject to change *

Talking to Children about Rules and Safety

Safety of our children is the most important part of what we do. Please talk with your child about the rules of riding the bus to make sure of their safety and that of the other children (Rules on back).

Parents must escort Pre-K and kindergarten children to and from the bus stop.

Rules

- Go directly to your own bus stop.
- Walk facing traffic and stay on the sidewalk, whenever possible.
- Be at your stop 10 minutes before pickup time.
- Don't talk or go with strangers.
- Dress for the weather. Wear clothing that is safe, visible and warm.
- Carry your belongings in a book bag or backpack.
- Show care for others' property.
- Do not bring pets to the bus stop.
- Stand on the sidewalk and back from the road at your bus stop. Do not climb snow banks.

Crossing the Road

- Wait for the bus driver to turn on all exterior signals before crossing and check for traffic.
- Make eye contact with the bus driver and walk far enough in front of the bus, so the bus driver can see you.

Safe Bus Behavior

- Do not distract the bus driver
- Remain seated while the bus is moving.
- Elementary students must wear seat belts.
- Eating and smoking are not allowed.
- Keep arms and heads inside windows
- Do not throw objects of any kind, inside or outside of the bus.

School Closings and Delays

We've added a new feature to our phone directory which includes, school cancellation and delays. This will be an option for you to select after you have dialed our office number (518) 370-8103. To ensure you are getting the latest updates on closings and delays, please listen to your local radio station and watch local news channels, as the directory option may be delayed.

Student Behavior

Students who are distractive or cannot follow rules may have bus transportation privileges suspended. In such cases, the parents and/or guardians become responsible for safely getting their child to and from school.

Please talk with your child and stress appropriate behavior at the bus stop and while riding the bus to and from school.

Student Success Begins with Attendance

The path to graduation begins with coming to school

The first day of kindergarten is one of the first steps a child takes on the path to graduation. It is a critical time and can set the tone for the educational journey that he or she is beginning. Stressing the importance of being in school every day and encouraging your child to develop a love of learning, sends the right message. It lets your child know that education is a priority to you and will become a priority to him or her.

As a parent, you are responsible for making sure your child gets to school each day. While you might think that a few absences here and a few absences there won't impact learning, they do.

Missing 18 days of school, which is ten percent of the time, is considered chronic absenteeism.

Chronic Absence	Missing 18 days in a school year
Warning – Cause for Concern	Missing 10 – 17 days in a school year
Good Attendance	Missing 9 days or fewer in a school year

When children miss one day of school, they miss an entire day of instruction. For every day missed, it takes a child at least two days of school to catch up and they must work twice as hard. They miss opportunities and skill development and have a harder time learning to read. Additionally, a teacher loses class time by having to teach one student something the entire class was taught the day before. An absence impacts the entire class.

In the 2019-2020 school year, we will continue our **#projectbehere** attendance awareness campaign in which we feature students who have good and improved attendance, on posters, social media and on our website.

#projectbehere stories, video clips and resources are available on our district website. Follow us on Twitter **#projectbehere**.

What attendance tells us:

- Absences can be a sign that a student is losing interest in school, struggling with school work, dealing with a bully or a facing other serious difficulties.
- By 6th grade, absenteeism is one of three signs that a student may drop out of high school.
- By 9th grade, regular and high attendance is a better predictor of graduation than 8th grade test scores.
- Missing 10 percent, or 18 days, of the school year can dramatically affect a student's academic success.

What you can do

- Talk about the importance of going to school every day. Make it an expectation.
- Set a regular bed time and morning routine. Help your child maintain daily routines such as finishing homework and getting a good night's sleep.
- Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before.
- Try not to schedule any appointments, including medical or dental, during the school day.
- Don't schedule family vacations for times when school is session.
- Don't let your child stay home unless truly sick. Complaints of headaches or stomachaches may be signs of anxiety.
- If your child seems anxious about going to school, talk to teachers, school counselors, or other parents for advice on how to make him or her feel comfortable and excited about learning.
- Develop back-up plans for getting to school if something comes up. Call on a family member, a neighbor or other parents.

Help your child stay engaged

- Stay on top of academic progress and seek help from teachers if necessary. Make sure teachers know how to contact you.
- Stay on top of your child's social contacts. Peer pressure can lead to skipping school.
- Encourage meaningful afterschool activities including sports and clubs.

Talk to teachers if you notice sudden changes in behavior. Log in to Campus Parent Portal and check your child's attendance frequently.

If you are having trouble getting your child to school, ask for help. Talk to school officials, afterschool programs, other parents or community agencies. We will help you find the resources that you need.

This year, the Schenectady City School District has sharpened focus on student attendance by bringing awareness to the impact of chronic absenteeism and providing the tools and resources to ensure that all students are in school and on the path to graduation.

Since missing school can dramatically affect a child's academic success, we strongly encourage parents to closely monitor how many days of school their child is absent. **We offer you a powerful tool to do this.**

The Parent Portal

The Parent Portal is a web-based platform that allows you real-time access to schedules, grades and attendance data for all of your children. The process for signing up is simple:

Fill out the attached form.

Chronic absence from school can dramatically affect a student's academic success.

- Missing 18 days of school or more in a school year is considered chronic absenteeism.
- Missing between 10-17 days in a school year is cause for concern.

Starting as early as Pre-K and Kindergarten, chronic absence can have adverse academic consequences.

By 3rd grade, chronically absent students are less likely to read on grade level.

By 6th grade, chronic absence becomes a warning sign that a student will drop out of high school.

By 9th grade, attendance is a better predictor of graduation than 8th grade test scores.

Good attendance is having 9 or fewer absences for the entire school year.


- Send the form to your student's school with a copy of your I.D.





Vaccinations/Change in Law for Religious Exemption

Per the amendment to Public Health Law Section 2164, children who attend daycare or public, private or parochial school who previously had a religious exemption, **must now receive their first age-appropriate dose in each immunization series with a deadline of 14 days from the start of school**. Parents and guardians of children must show, within 30 days of the first day of school, that appointments have been made for follow-up doses.

Food Services/Community Eligibility Provision (CEP)

The Schenectady City School District participates in the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) program. All children in the Schenectady City School District will receive free breakfast and lunch at their school each day.

The District also participates in the Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program for all elementary students.

The use of pesticide products may be applied periodically throughout the 2019-2020 school year at the Schenectady City School District.
